#### Sixth Form - school or college

Sixth form colleges offer students aged 16 to 19 the opportunity to study for qualifications such as GCSEs, A-levels, International Baccalaureate Diplomas and BTEC qualifications. In August 2013 it became compulsory for young people to remain in education until year 12 and by 2015, education will be compulsory until year 13. Those wishing to continue can choose to stay on at their secondary school if it has an attached sixth form; transfer to a local sixth form college, or go to a more vocational further education college. Students at sixth-form colleges typically study for two years (known as Years 12 and 13, or lower sixth and upper sixth). In Greenwich sixth form education is available from the following schools and colleges. In sixth forms/sixth form colleges students can study a range of academic subjects and vocational qualifications.

#### **Greenwich Young People's Council**



Greenwich Young People's Council is a group of elected young people represents the views of children and young people from across the borough and influences decision-making within the council. Representative youth councilors are aged 11-18 and up to age 25 for disabled young people. Councilors are elected from schools and colleges across Greenwich, and include representatives from the Children in Care Council, Greenwich's youth service and representatives of young people with special educational needs and disabilities. Elections take place every two years in November and are an open nomination process.

#### The Greenwich Youth Voice Group



Greenwich Youth Voice Group is a new short-term youth voice group which will represent young people who go to school, college, alternative education or youth services in the Royal Borough, and members of the Children in Care Council. Its role will be to review, shape and drive the 2015 Greenwich Young People's Council (GYPC) elections. The group will also help shape how young people can have their voices heard and make change in the borough. The YVG will have an important role in designing the **new** Greenwich Young People's Council before the election nominations open in October 2015. To take part young people must already be a member of their school or college council, youth forum or the Royal Greenwich Children in Care Council. Participants will be offered full training and support by Greenwich's Youth Voice Service. All young people who are involved in the group will also receive national ASDAN (Award Scheme Development and Accreditation Network) accreditation for their work. YVG members will also be eligible to stand in the 2015 GYPC election to continue representing their school, college, alternative education or youth service, if they wish to do so.
