Anticipated Housing & Population Change

Housing

According to the 2001 and 2011 Census, the largest household (with usual residents) growth occurred in the northern Royal Borough wards including:

- **§** Woolwich Riverside (2,427 households) accounting for a 42.5% change
- § Thamesmead Moorings (2,011 households) accounting for a 40.7% change
- § Greenwich West (1,671 households) accounting for a 30.8% change
- Peninsula (1,546 households) accounting for a 33.2% change
- § Glyndon (942 households) accounting for a 16.2% change

The Royal Borough housing trajectory (up to 2028) anticipates that further housing growth will continue to take place in the northen Royal Borough wards including:

- One-third (33.2%) of the total housing development coming forward will occur in the Peninsula ward approximately 12,200 units
- § 10,700 new homes are planned for Woolwich Riverside accounting for 29.1% of the borough's total residential development
- § Over 3,000 new homes anticipated in both the Greenwich West and Thamesmead Moorings wards
- § More than 2,100 homes to be delivered in Eltham West; forming part of the Kidbrooke Village development

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Population

According to the 2001 and 2011 Census, the largest population growth occurred in the northern Royal Borough wards including:

- **§** Thamesmead Moorings (7,960 people) accounting for a 67.6% change
- **§** Woolwich Riverside (6,371 people) accounting for a 50% change
- **§** Greenwich West (5,311 people) accounting for a 47.4% change
- § Glyndon (4,297 people) accounting for a 31% change
- **§** Peninsula (3,883 people) accounting for a 38.2% change

The Greater London Authority (GLA) SHLAA-based population projection anticipates that between 2011 and 2041, further population growth will be concentrated in the northen Royal Borough wards including:

- § 40.3% of the total projected population growth is estimated to occur in the Peninsula ward (38,628 people)
- § 21,631 new residents are estimated to come forward in Woolwich Riverside accounting for 22.6% of the borough's total population growth
- § Furthermore, the cumulative population growth of Eltham West is estimated to increase by 76.3% (7,967 people)


