

WHO ARE THE FAMILY HOLIDAY ASSOCIATION?

We are the only national charity dedicated to providing breaks and day trips for families struggling with some of the toughest challenges life can bring.

The families we help are affected by issues such as adult disability, severe and sudden illness, bereavement, mental health issues and domestic violence. Every year we help thousands of families, most of whom have never had a family holiday before.

WHAT DO THE BREAKS INVOLVE?

The majority of breaks we provide are short trips to a seaside holiday park, but we also provide stays at city hotels and quieter cottages. These locations enable families to have a holiday just like any other family, and to make use of all the facilities on offer.

We also enable families to go on day trips – perhaps a simple day out at the seaside, local tourist attraction or museum - whether by themselves or as part of a group. We do not offer trips abroad.

WHAT DIFFERENCE DOES A BREAK MAKE?

The Family Holiday Association was founded over 40 years ago on the principle that spending quality time together as a family away from home results in stronger, healthier and happier families and communities. It is a principle that survives to this day.

Research shows that a Family Holiday Association break can improve social well-being and quality of life. Recent studies by the University of Nottingham found that our breaks help families with their confidence and increase positive family bonding. Our breaks have also motivated parents to improve their work prospects once they return home, and helped to improve children's school attendance.

WHO DO WE HELP

We can help families, defined as "dependent children and those who care for them", who:

- have at least one child under the age of 18
- have not been on holiday in the last four years
- are living on a low income.

All families must be referred to us by someone working with them in a supporting role. Doing things this way ensures we select families who most need our help, and means families get the support they need to prepare for their break.

HOW DOES THE CHARITY WORK WITH REFERRERS?

Our referrers come from a range of organisations including:

- Schools
- Social services
- Children's centres
- Other charities
- Refuges and domestic abuse support services
- Housing associations
- Community health teams

Referrers act as a family's point of contact throughout the process. As well as submitting the application, referrers help the family to book and prepare for their break and ensure that feedback is sent to us afterwards.

All applications are made online through our website, as are most of our bookings and post-holiday feedback. To access our application form you'll need to register with us as a referrer first, and we'll get back to you with login details within one working day.
