



 - harassment. This is where someone keeps being treated badly because of their disability, background or community
 - **bullying**. This is where someone is threatened or harmed


a) Work to treat everyone in the same fair way.

f) Help people from different communities to work well together.




g) Make sure the organisations that work with us treat everyone in the same fair way.
