Social Value Framework

Introduction

The Royal Borough is utilising the Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012 to deliver on its commitment to making the most out of every 'Greenwich Pound' spend and improve the wellbeing of its residents. As such, we are embedding a social value approach into our commissioning and procurement activities. Social Value is interpreted in different ways by different Organisations, but in Greenwich, it is defined as - outcomes offered by a contractor as **additional** benefits **over and above** the core requirements of the commissioning or procurement exercise. This means a social value offer from a potential supplier **should not** add cost to the tender price. To ensure the social value delivered through our commissioning and procurement activities addresses the real economic, social and environmental wellbeing needs of the residents, the social value outcomes sought in contracts are intrinsically linked to the 8 corporate themes of the pre-procurement phase, which outcomes are best suited to the procurement and will include them in the procurement.
