I'm so proud to be Royal Greenwich's new Cabinet Member for Housing, Neighbourhoods and Homelessness. Having been brought up on the borough's housing estates, I know the importance of a safe, secure and good-quality home.

I am also conscious that with over 20,000 people currently on our housing waiting list, it is vital that we increase the supply of affordable housing, something we are working hard to achieve through our Greenwich Builds programme and maximising the number of homes affordable to local people in private developments.

When it comes to repairs, we are catching up on the backlog caused by Covid-19 and are working on major efficiencies to the service which should bring big improvements over the next couple of years. I can't wait to get to work with the Council's housing team, and build on all the work already started.

As well as being my first issue, this is the 20th edition of Talk Housing. Looking over past issues it's great to see how much has been achieved in the last five years, from work to tackle the climate emergency to the building of hundreds of new Greenwich Builds council homes.

Work begins on our largest council home scheme so far



We are excited to announce construction work has started on the largest development so far in our Greenwich Builds programme.

This fantastic new development at *Kidbrooke* Park Road North will provide 117 homes, 12 of which will be wheelchair accessible, for local people on our housing waiting lists. There will also be a nursery for new tenants and local Kidbrooke residents alike.

High sustainability standards will be achieved by using air source heat pumps (see inset below), solar panels and efficient insulation, while large landscaped outdoor areas and a tree-lined corridor with 69 new trees will provide plenty of outside space for residents.

The new homes are due to be complete in 2024.

Innovative energy centre maximises efficiency

We're building a state-of-the-art energy centre to serve our new Kidbrooke Park Road development with heating and hot water through an efficient air source heat pump system, combined with thermal stores and an electric boiler.

The heat pumps will contribute to at least 90% of the heating and hot water demand, reducing carbon dioxide emissions and running costs for tenants.





New homes for residents with learning difficulties



We are pleased to announce that a new development of purpose-built homes for people with learning disabilities is now under construction in West Greenwich.

The scheme will house nine residents across six homes, two of which are wheelchair accessible, with an extra bedroom for staff.

Each home will have access to a sensory garden, vegetable planters and an external dining area. A screened roof terrace will also be available for residents to use. New homes will be due for completion in 2023.

Do you know how SIP panels help us build council homes?

Using state of the art technology, new council homes will be built a whole lot faster. This includes modular construction and structured *insulated* panels, or SIPs for short.

SIPs consist of rigid foam insulation sandwiched between two solid panels, which are made off-site then craned into place to make buildings. This allows for faster, more energy efficient and less disruptive construction.

SIPs buildings are much more efficient than those built using older methods, with interiors which are cool in summer but retain heat in the winter. They are around 50% more energy efficient, so running costs for tenants are reduced, and are much quieter to live in thanks to the amount of insulation used.

SIPs are also stronger than traditionally made building surfaces, and can be used in roofs and floors to span as much as 18 feet without additional support, allowing for more flexibility in building design.

If you want to see a building made with SIPs just head over to Green Way in Eltham, where you'll see two newly completed Greenwich Builds homes providing a shining example of the SIPs method!

Fly-tipping – what you need know

Are you getting rid of large items? Do you know how to get rid of your bulky waste?

Don't just dump it, use our bulk waste service to get rid of your waste.

Over the past few months, we have seen unauthorised dumping of waste including household items in local areas and this has been raised by several residents and businesses.

Fly-tipping is a serious concern for the environment for a number of reasons;

- Fly-tipping attracts vermin to the local area which can cause health issues.
- Incorrectly disposed of waste can be toxic or act as a choking hazard to animals.
- Toxic waste can pollute the local soil, affecting local plants and wildlife.

If you are a Royal Borough of Greenwich tenant, we offer a free collection service for residents to dispose of their bulky waste.

News for Royal Greenwich tenants and leaseholders

Some of our services are below the set targets and we are working hard to improve these. If you are interested in helping us to improve our service standards please email

Housing complaints are a focus for us in 2022-23 with the introduction of the Housing Ombudman's new Complaint Handling Code. We are reviewing our approach to complaint handling and will deliver a range of improvements over the next 6 months with a focus on learning from where we have made mistakes or failed to meet residents' expectations.

Due to Covid-19, there has been a backlog of nonurgent repairs. Work commenced in July 2021 to clear the backlog. The number of outstanding non-urgent repairs is currently under 2,000. Whilst this backlog is being cleared, regrettably, the published target of 90% will not be achieved, however, it is anticipated that the service will improve by the end of 2023 and the targets will be met.

Repairing of empty properties was affected by Covid-19. We commenced working on the backlog of over 400 properties following the easing of restrictions in July 2021. A review of the service is underway to change how we repair and let properties and to get us closer to meeting the set target.

Estate Parking is changing.

New resident and visitor permits will be available online soon.

We will write to all residents on affected estates to explain how and when you can purchase your permit.
