## Introduction



#### Hello!

Thank you for your interest in joining Greenwich Young People's Council (GYPC) to represent your school, college or community group.

GYPC is a group of elected young people (aged 11 to 18, or up to 25 if they have a disability) who give young people a LOUD voice in decisions that affect them.

A BIG part of their role is to influence decision-making within the council – including local and national politicians. They meet weekly to discuss issues, plan projects and campaign, and meet the people with the power!

There are **loads of benefits** to being a Youth Councillor:

- Lots of fun!
- The opportunity to have your voice heard AND make positive changes locally
- The chance to represent other young people in your community
- Meet new people across Greenwich, London and the UK.
- Opportunities to gain accreditations and awards.
- Receiving free training, coaching and mentoring and a reference!
- AND MORE!

As a Youth Councillor, you'll need to commit 2-3 hours every week to:

- Attend GYPC meetings, representing young people.
- Actively contributing to and leading campaigns and events.
- Take part in additional opportunities, such as interview panels or consultations.
- Complete your national AQA awards.
- Check and respond to emails, texts or messages.

#### There is also an opportunity to become a Member of Youth Parliament (MYP).

The candidates with the most votes across Greenwich will be offered the role of MYP or Deputy MYP. MYP's represent GYPC nationally, and have additional responsibilities to youth councillors. More information will be provided at the candidate training day.

#### **Your Manifesto**



A manifesto is a statement of what you want to achieve if you're elected as Member of Youth Parliament. Remember, the candidate with the highest number of votes will be offered the role of Member of Youth Parliament and the running up two candidates will be offered the roles of Deputy Members of Youth Parliament. Other runners up will become Youth Councillors. It's a really important part of your election campaign. It's what young people will read to decide whether or not they should vote for you.

Your manifesto needs to be no more than 150 words. It should include up to 3 issues that you will tackle if you're elected AND an overall summary explaining why young people should vote for you.

#### What makes a GREAT manifesto?

- 1. Be yourself show your passion and energy!
- 2. Be realistic think about what you could actually do if elected.
- 3. Be clear about what you're hoping to change.
- 4. Keep it short and accessible (e.g. use simple language for maximum impact!). 5. Remember this is about why you'd make a GREAT Member of Youth Parliament.
- 6. Double check spelling, grammar and punctuation!

#### For example:

"I'm passionate about the arts! I want young people to have more to explore their creative talents. I will deliver workshops and events that will encourage this."

"Young people don't understand the impact of littering. I want to lead a project to encourage young people to respect their environment and use litter bins."

"You should vote for me because I'm reliable, outspoken and will get decision-makers listening to what young people say!"

#### **Code of Conduct**

We want to make sure everyone who participates in the election to have GREAT experience. To make sure this happens, we ask all candidates to sign up to this code of conduct.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. I will treat all candidates and supporters with respect and fairness.
- 2. I will act in such a way that is not sexist, racist, homophobic or discriminatory in any way, and I will report any such behaviour if I experience it.
- 3. I will lead a campaign that is fair, clear and positive.
- 4. I will demonstrate integrity and will not deliberately disadvantage other candidates, including defacing posters or distributing negative campaign materials.
- 5. I understand that I am independent and will not seek the public or financial support of political parties, community, faith or any other adult groups.
- 6. I understand that all of the above also applies to my manifesto, campaign materials AND social media platforms (e.g. Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter, etc.).
- 7. I understand that if, in the opinion of The Royal Borough of Greenwich and/or Participation People, I break this code of conduct OR jeopardise the reputation of The Royal Borough of Greenwich/ GYPC or Participation People, I may be disqualified.

### Support for your application



To stand as a candidate, you need to collect 25 signatures of support.

These signatures should be other young people from your school, youth or community group who support your candidate application. It's also an opportunity for you to talk to young people about what things they want GYPC to do!

To get these signatures, you could:

- Deliver presentations in assemblies.
- Use social media.
- Use break/lunch times at school to ask young people to support you.
